

#### Ranjana script

Ranjana script is a beautiful attractive, interesting and artistic script of Newari language. The word Ranjan is reffered to as joy. The pattern and shape of this script is very attractive and it brings joy to the mind. Therefore, Ranjana script is considered to be a high-level artistic script from a creative point of view. This script is especially important in the form of cultural scripts.

It is used mostly in Buddhist texts, Buddhist Chaitya monasteries, Dhyanachakra 'mane' ( Prayer Wheels ), inscriptions, copper plates, etc. Therefore, the increase of popularity of the Ranjana script is credited to the Buddhists. Ranjana script is believed to have been prevalent since the 5th century Lichchivi period. However, it is believed that from the 11th century to the 16th century, this script have been in widespread use. This script is mostly used in Nepal, India, Tibet, China, Japan, Thailand, Korea, Burma, Mongolia, Sikkim, Bhutan etc. as a part of the extension of the Buddhism. The famous Buddhist book 'Prajnaparamita' written in Ranjana script is considered to be the oldest book of Nepal. This book, written in Nepal Samvat 40, year 920, is considered to be the oldest preserved book in Nepal.

Ranjana script is considered to be the original script created in Nepal's own land by its people. Although the original source of this script is Brahmi script, After the development of the original Sanskrit script from the Brahmi script, it is believed that the Ranjana script and the Devanagari script were further developed. Therefore, the writing style of Ranjana and Devanagari script and some characters are similar. However, Ranjana script looks very different and attractive from Devanagari script in terms of shape and writing style, ered to be the oldest preserved book in Nepal.


Characteristics of Ranjana script and its style of writing The main feature of the Ranjana script is the outlook of the pattern of heads and tails. When adding a straight line on the head, the thickness in the front is made bigger and the back is made narrower. And in the stem, the original column of the letter



The decision to draw up stencils which have all the strokes that require to write any text in Ranjana Lipi came through intensive testing of ways to simplify the initial learning phases of the Ranjana Script. Someone who has very little command over the brush stroke techniques and who is in the learning phase would benefit from the stencil tool greatly. Rather than thinking of this as a new form of writing the script, it is a small step towards learning to write the letters through gaining skills of brush strokes and techniques by combination of which different letters are formed.
